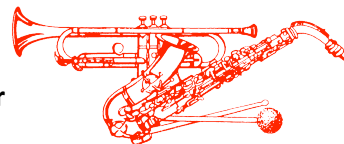

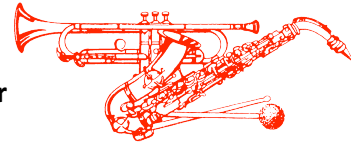

**Faneuil Hall, Boston**

**1 Faneuil Hall Square, Boston, MA 0219**

Built in 1742, and expanded in 1806, the Declaration of Independence was read from the balcony of Faneuil Hall on July 18, 1776. The Festival is held on the second floor, in the Great Hall. Bands play starting at 11 a.m. We are scheduled to play at 2 p.m. This historic venue is accessible by "T" (Government Center) and there is self-pay parking nearby. There is elevator access through the gift shop. Further instruction will be handed out during rehearsal.
